



The Caston High School Scholarship

The Caston High School Scholarship was created by the Caston Community Academic Scholarship Foundation, previously known as the Caston High School Dollars for Scholars Committee, to benefit graduating students from Caston High School.

On January 1, 1964 Adams, Bethlehem, Wayne, and Liberty Townships consolidated into a single school district which would later be named Caston. The name 'Caston' was derived from the names of the two counties involved: the first three letters of the word 'Cass,' as in Cass County, and the last three letters of 'Fulton.'

The Caston High School Scholarship Fund is a permanent fund and will benefit qualifying students who will graduate from Caston High School and who have attended Caston High School for four consecutive years. Students should also demonstrate good citizenship, should participate in extracurricular activities, and should value work and community involvement.

The Caston Comets school colors are red, white, and blue, and the school song is titled, *Wave the Flag for Caston Comets*. The song is set to the music of "Wave the Flag for Old Chicago," which is the University of Chicago Fight Song. The words were written by Mr. Berdine with the assistance of Cathy Cameron.
